Brydon Barclay: Hailing from Unst, the land of rum and red tins, Brydon's boat-building skills have come in useful over the winter.

Musicians: The Jarl squad are accompanied this year by the musical stylings of Andy "Shakin" Stephen, Ryan Couper and Lewie Peterson.



The Saga of Hrollaug Rognvaldsson

Guizer Jarl Michael Nisbet is assuming the role of Hrollaug Rognvaldsson. This is his story:

Hrollaug (Pronounced "Hrot-lowg" and meaning "Consecrated Fame") lived around the year 900 AD. He was a son of the mighty Jarl Rognvald of More, on the west coast of Norway. Rognvald gained earldom of the Nordreys (Orkney and Shetland) in the late 9th century. This was given by King Harold as compensation for the death of another of his sons, Ivarr. Rognvald returned to Norway and the earldom of the islands was taken over by firstly his brother Sigurd Eysteinsson, then by his sons Hallad and 'Torf' Einar. Hrollaug volunteered to be Earl of the Isles, but his father thought him unlikely to be successful there as he was too kind of heart. Instead Rognvald directed him west to Iceland where he predicted that he would become a prosperous and noble man. The Orkneyinga Saga says: *Then Hrollaug asked, "Do you want me to go?" The earl says, "Not for you is the earldom destined, the spirits that follow you lie towards Iceland; there you will increase your race and be a famous man in that land."*

When Hrollaug's first saw land on his voyage to Iceland, he cast overboard his high seat pillars* but lost sight of them as his ship was churned around in an ocean storm. He landed in Miry-Creek, in the Nesses, where he wintered until finally hearing news of where his pillars had made landfall. He settled in Hornfirth where he was known to be a great lord, kind and generous to his people.

The popular Hrollaug kept up friendship with King Harald of Norway, but never went abroad. King Harald sent him a sword, an alehorn and a gold ring which weighed five ounces. Hrollaug is still a well-known name in Iceland, and many Icelanders can claim to be descendant from the Jarl. Hrollaugseyjar, a small set of islands off the south east coast of Iceland, were named after Hrollaug. Stories about Hrottlaug are still passed down through the generations over 1000 years after his death. His gravesite survives to this day.

* As wood was sometimes a scarcity, Viking settlers took a large supply with them on their voyages. These pillars could be used for building but were sometimes highly decorative, adorning either side of the Jarl's throne as a symbol of wealth and status. It was thought to be lucky to toss these spars into the sea and allow them to wash ashore. Wherever they made landfall was where the Jarl would settle. The spar washing to shore also indicated that other useful resources would be brought by the tide.

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



Up Helly Aa 1985



Below is the full report from Cullivoe Up Helly Aa when Michael's father Andrew was Guizer Jarl. Reproduced with kind permission from *The Shetland Times* (8th March 1985).

"Last Thursday provided one of the best evenings ever for a Cullivoe Up-Helly-Aa and many people commented that it was more like a regatta in midsummer than a late-winter fire festival.

The galley, *Reall*, looked particularly splendid this year as it lead the procession in perfect weather conditions. Guizer Jarl Andrew Nisbet's squad were resplendent in crushed velvet cloaks - red for the Jarl and blue for his squad members. Their new-style shields were black and silver with a ferocious looking spike in the centre.

THE SQUADS

1. The Benny Hill Show. An amusing squad, based on the television show, with scenes of a scantily clad lady being chased in double-quick time; a rather messy attempt at eating spaghetti and a slightly mysterious shootout involving a clay duck.

2. Festive Foy. Once again the lasses' squad got top marks for their beautiful costume. This year they wore old-time Shetland claes consisting of beautifully made lace-trimmed bonnets, Shetland shawls and "rivlins". Accompanied by a guitar and fiddle they sang and dance, sat down with their "sock" and then handed out song-sheets concerning topical events sung to the tune of Kittie Beardie.

3. Super Brain. Not unlike the television programme Mastermind, but the contestants did not appear to have such a wide range of interests - all of them choosing very definitely North Yell specialist subjects such as the History of Wast Firth. A clever squad with topical questions and answers which finally determined a winner - the young lady contestant who was so overcome with delight that she had to passionately embrace all the gentlemen, not least the Jarl who made the presentation.

4. Salmon Brothers Seabase. The title of this squad speaks for itself, concerning the topical salmon cages versus oil development dispute over Basta Voe. A most amusing interplay between two salmon farmers, a well-known councillor and two seabase planning officials. Unfortunately all the hard work and speculation was in vain, thanks to a marvellously realistic otter who attacked the salmon cages and removed the greater part of the bone of contention.

5. Whose Baby. This squad closely followed the television programme of the same name but with one big difference - no-one was willing to claim as their own any of the large and hairy babies who trundled around on pram, trike and baby-walkers.

6. Gutcher Geese. This squad imitated the real life pet geese fed and cared for by the Gutcher ferrymen, although no-one has yet seen these geese doing the Birdie Dance.

7. Ten-in-a-Bed and 8. Old MacDonald's Farm. These were the bairns' squads which performed with their usual enthusiasm, singing well despite being pushed out of a massive bed in the first squad and displaying beautiful costumes in the second squad.

9. Hamefarin. A uniformed ferryman ushered in visitors from all the airts, all home for the Hamefarin. He introduced them to an incredibly dressed Shetland lady wearing an "all over" dress, matching leg warmers and a sheepskin. The visitors came from Australia, the Philippines, Scotland and America. The American visitor was no less than a very realistic B.A. Baracus. After a dram and a chat they all danced a Shetland reel.

10. Does Du Tink The Price Is Right? Again based on the television programme. This squad of young people gave a most amusing take-off and the celebrity contestants were most realistic. Dolly Parton won the main prize - tickets for a tour of the new Cullivoe Hall - but she preferred to take home the debonair young host.

11. Gibbie's Part-Timers. The new fish factory was the theme of this amusing squad set at the filleting table. After a lot of bickering and squabbling the manager himself ended up being filleted.

The evening was voted a great success with the festivities carrying on until the early hours of Friday morning to the music of Johnny Clark, Robert Goodlad, Gordon, Victor and Margaret.

The Guizers' Hop the following evening was, if possible, an even greater success. A well-attended concert began the evening's entertainment with the Oakbank Sound, Eddie Barclay, the Smith Sisters and Margaret Robertson, followed by a dance to the music of the talented young Oakbank Sound.

This was the last Up-Helly-Aa in the old Cullivoe Hall and everything went off without a hitch - not even the power cut that brought the Tilley lights out at last year's festival."
