

Wir Guizer Jarl - Steven Brown

Our Chief Guizer this year is Steven Brown from Burravoe, South Yell. He has chosen to represent King Logi Fornjotson.

This is Steven's third time in the Jarl Squad, having previously been in Robert (Halfdan the Black) Thomson's squad in 2000 and Craig (Sweyn Asliefsson) Dickie's squad in 2020.

A long time supporter of Cullivoe Up Helly Aa, he started his squad adventures in the fledgling "Mid Yell squad" in 1993, and then went onto the Burravoe squad in the 2000s.



Steven works for EnQuest at the Sullom Voe Oil Terminal, where he is part of the Emergency Response team and the Operations team, loading oil over the jetties and onto the ships that come in to berth. Over the weekend, Steven and his squad will be raising money for Alzheimer Scotland, as well as the Macmillan Nurses Shetland Branch.

A foreword from the Jarl:

"I sensed something in the air when I came home to a noisy household full of the Dickie clan, and then a moment of shock when Craig asked me to be the next Jarl. But after a quick chat with my wife Marina, I accepted the honour and have relished taking on the role. After two hard years of waiting due to the Covid pandemic restrictions, there is a real sense of excitement to get Up Helly Aa going again, although the committee did an exceptional job over those years with the online festival and the Rayen Banner Ball.

None of this would be possible for me if I didn't have the love and support of Marina and my two daughters, Lucy and Kerry, by my side, organising and keeping me right. I am hugely grateful for their support. Also huge thanks must go to all my squad members, musicians and galley builders, for keeping things going and supporting me along the way.






The Saga of Logi Fornjotson

"Out of the *Orkneyinga Saga* came the legend of a king named Fornjot, who was said to be a giant, and he ruled over Gotland, which we now know as Finland and Kvenland.

He had three sons, Ægir (who ruled over the seas), Logi (who ruled over fire) and Kári (who ruled over the wind).

I have chosen to portray Logi Fornjotson, King of Hálogaland, which was in the far north of Norway.

Born around the year 360, Logi was the most handsome of men, but with the strength and size of the giants from whom he was descended.

As Logi was larger and stronger than any other man in the land, his name was lengthened to Hálogi Fornjotson, and from that name, the country was called Hálogaland.

The saga tells that Hálogi's wife was called Queen Glöd Grimsdatter, or Gloő (which translates to 'red-hot embers'), and they had two daughters, Eisa Logisdatter (translating to "glowing embers") who was born around 380 and Eimyrja Logisdatter (translating to "embers") who was born around 390.

As the first king of Hálogaland, Logi passed away around 419 at the age of 59, which was a grand old age for the time.

I chose to portray King Logi Fornjotson, as I found some common ground with him. Like Logi, I am married with two daughters, and I have been associated with fire most of my working days, having been in the Emergency Response team at Sullom Voe oil Terminal since the early 90s.

I have called my galley 'Ægir Kári' after the two brothers of Logi, so the Galley name roughly translates into 'Sea Wind', or as I like to look at it from a Shetland perspective, 'Sea Storm'."






